Mt Bundy Station Pty Ltd Pty Ltd, hereby gives notice it has applied to the Director of Liquor Licensing to vary current Liquor Licence 80819233. The application is for a Restaurant Bar authority for their premises known as Mount Bundy Station located at 315 Haynes Road ADELAIDE RIVER NT 0846.

LIQUOR LICENCE AUTHORITY APPLICATION

We are applying for a restaurant bar Authority to allow the provision of alcohol to patrons within the licenced premises of Mt Bundy station. The proposed business will operate within the stations hospitality service, offering a selectin of alcoholic beverages to both guests and visitors. The service will be conducted in accordance with responsible service of alcohol principles.

Monday to Sunday: 10:00 – 23:59 hours

Good Friday and Christmas Day liquor trading hours – 11:00 – 21:00 hours

Hours of operation for extended to 01:00 hours for Special Events

Objections to the liquor licence application

An objection may only be made on the following grounds:

- a) that issuing the licence or authority, varying the conditions, substituting other premises or making the material alteration would adversely affect:
 - i. the amenity of the neighbourhood of the licensed premises or proposed licensed premises; or
 - ii. the health, education, public safety or social conditions in the community of the licensed premises or proposed licensed premises;
- b) that the applicant is not a fit an proper person.

Only the following may make an objection:

- a) a person residing or working in the neighbourhood of the licensed premises or proposed licensed premises;
- b) the owner or occupier of land in the neighbourhood of the licensed premises or proposed licensed premises;
- c) a local council of the local government area where the licensed premises or proposed licensed premises are located;
- d) a Member of the Legislative Assembly;
- e) a police officer or employee of the Police Force, acting in that capacity;
- f) a member or employee of the Northern Territory Fire and Rescue Service, established under the Fire and Emergency Act 1996, acting in that capacity;
- g) an Agency or public authority that performs functions relating to public amenities, including health, education and public safety;
- h) a charity or a community-based organisation or body.

The objection must be lodged with the Director **within 14 days** of the publication of the notice and:

- a) be in writing or in a form approved by the Director that is suitable for someone unable to effectively communicate in writing; and
- b) be signed by or on behalf of the person or body making the objection; and
- c) set out the grounds of the objection and the facts relied on to support those grounds.

Applicant's right to respond to objection

The Director must provide the applicant with any objections lodged and notice of their right to respond to the objection.

The *Liquor Act 2019* requires a notice to be published of the application along with a detailed description of the business proposed to be conducted, how to obtain a copy of the Community Impact Assessment and how to lodge an objection to the liquor licence, which may be found at the following address:

We are applying for a Restaurant Bar Authority to allow the provision of alcohol to patrons within the licenced premises of Mt Bundy Station. The proposed business will operate within the station's hospitality services, offering a selection of alcoholic beverages to both guests and visitors. The service will be conducted in accordance with responsible service of alcohol principles.

<p>If no, what measures will be / have been implemented or maintained to address the potential for undue offence, annoyance, disturbance, or inconvenience to people who live or work in the vicinity of the proposed licensed premises or who are using, or travelling to or from, a place of public worship, a hospital or a school?</p>	<p>The concerns raised by the Coomalie Council and Adelaide River Police have been acknowledged and will be fully addressed as part of our compliance with their conditions. All staff will hold RSA's and RSA principles will be strictly adhered to in accordance with contemporary practices, and alcohol will only be served for consumption within the premises, with no takeaway sales permitted, thereby mitigating any potential impact on surrounding communities.</p> <p>The remote location of Mt Bundy Station further reduces the potential for any such issues to arise. Given the station's considerable distance from the nearest place of worship, health centre, school, and the township of Adelaide River, the likelihood of causing any undue offence, annoyance, disturbance, or inconvenience to individuals living, working, or traveling in the vicinity is extremely low.</p>

<p>If yes, please share it here</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">Yes / No</p> <p>All staff members will undertake RSA training with a reputable provider before they begin working at the premises. This will ensure they can serve alcohol to the community in a responsible and safe manner. Generally, all staff members will:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. sight the ID of any individuals who look to be under the age of 25 to ensure that no minors are served alcohol; 2. look for signs that a community member is intoxicated and refuse the service of alcohol to any such community member; and 3. utilise harm minimisation strategies when serving or denying service of alcohol. <p>There will be a clear procedure for reporting incidents, for example, where someone was denied service of alcohol. These reports will be reviewed regularly to consider how procedures can be improved. Staff will offer non-alcoholic beverages for patrons and will actively monitor patrons' behaviour to identify signs of intoxication.</p> <p>Where a patron repeatedly breaches local laws and Mt Bundy Station policies, an application may be made to bar the patron from the licensed premises. Staff will work with local law enforcement and community members to stay informed about community needs and address any alcohol related issues collaboratively.</p>

<p>Tell us about the impact you think your proposed liquor licence or licence-related authorisation will have on the local community*</p>	<p>The proposed liquor licence pertains to a rural station situated in a remote and isolate location. Given its distance from the nearest local town (4.2 km from Adelaide River), the impact on the surrounding community is expected to be minimal. The location's isolation ensures that there will be negligible disturbance or inconvenience to the residents and workers in the vicinity.</p> <p>The granting of this licence is anticipated to have positive effects on the local area by fostering employment and tourism opportunities. These developments will contribute to economic growth and sustainability of the region without adversely affecting the local community.</p> <p>Liquor will not be permitted to be taken off the premises, ensuring it remains controlled and responsibly consumed on-site. The business is committed to maintaining a safe and ethical environment, with strict alcohol management practices in place to prevent irresponsible consumption of alcohol. We are dedicated to ensuring that alcohol consumption does not negatively impact the local community.</p>

<p>If yes, explain who you consulted (e.g. local residents and businesses, clinics, etc.), how (e.g. in person, by phone or email) and what their feedback was</p>	<p>We have reached out to several businesses and individuals in the area via phone and email. Despite multiple follow up attempts, many have not responded.</p> <p>We received feedback from key individuals who live or work in the vicinity of our premises, including Ms Sharon Hillen of the Coomalie Community Government Council, Officer Jack Trow of the Adelaide River Police, and Ms Felicity Keppie of the Adelaide River Community Health Centre. Ms Hillen and Officer Trow expressed support for the granting of the liquor licence, provided we comply with the licence conditions. Furthermore, Ms Keppie raised no concerns at this time, though the Health Centre may provide comments during the community consultation period.</p> <p>Overall, the feedback we have received thus far from individuals in the local area has been positive. Our goal is to ensure a positive presence in the community, and if granted this licence, we are committed to engaging with the community in a safe and beneficial manner.</p>


<p>If yes, explain who you consulted, how and what their feedback was</p>	<p>We contacted the Coomalie Community Government Council via email and subsequently discussed the matter with the Chief Executive Officer, Ms Sharon Hillen. Following these discussions with Ms Hillen, the Council discussed our client's liquor licence application at two separate meetings.</p> <p>On 17 September 2024, the Council expressed its support for the application, subject to the following conditions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Mt Bundy Station must operate in full compliance with the licence conditions, adhering to contemporary responsible service of alcohol principles; and 2. Mt Bundy Station must not offer a takeaway alcohol service from the venue to avoid contributing to alcohol management issues in surrounding communities. <p>The conditions outlined by the Council are acknowledged, and we will take all steps necessary to ensure full compliance with RSA principles and the prohibition of takeaway alcohol from the premises.</p> <p>Additionally, on 8 October 2024, Ms Hillen communicated that the Council had discussed the extent of the proposed application for Mt Bundy Station to apply for a liquor licence of a higher risk classification than its current licence and confirmed its support for the granting of the licence.</p>

<p>If yes, explain who you consulted, how and what their feedback was</p>	<p>On 1 October 2024, we contacted the Adelaide River Police Station via telephone and spoke with Officer Jack Trow. He confirmed his familiarity with Mt Bundy Station and expressed support for the application. His only inquiry concerned whether liquor would be sold for takeaway from the premises. We clarified that it would not, and he was satisfied with this response. No other concerns were expressed by Officer Trow or the Adelaide River Police at this time.</p>

<p>If yes, give the name of the place/s of worship and explain how you consulted people who access it and what their feedback was</p>	<p>The Catholic Church of the Resurrection, located at 19 Memorial Terrace, Adelaide River NT 0846, was contacted by phone for feedback regarding the potential impact of the application on those who access the church and travel to and from it. A message was left, but no response has been received within 30 days. Comments are still awaited during the community consultation period.</p>

<p>If yes, give the name of the hospital and how you consulted people who access it and what their feedback was</p>	<p>We contacted Adelaide River Community Health Centre by both email and phone. Felicity Keppie, the Primary Health Centre Manager, advised that there were no immediate concerns or feedback regarding the application. She noted that, pursuant to section 56(4)(a) of the Liquor Act 2019, the Centre will provide comments once the liquor licence application has been formally submitted.</p> <p>Ms Keppie further explained that the Mental Health, Alcohol and Other Drugs (MHAOD) Branch routinely reviews such applications and may provide recommendations from a harm minimisation perspective. She clarified that NT Health, which includes the Centre, will provide a single coordinated response, and no additional input from the Centre is expected at this time.</p>

A message was left for follow-up, but no response has been received within 30 days. Comments are still awaited during the community consultation period.</p>

<p>If yes, explain who you have consulted and how</p>	<p>We were unable to reach any representatives from the local school or place of worship to discuss potential risks of undue offence, annoyance, disturbance, or inconvenience to the people who use these services. However, we did speak with Ms Felicity Keppie, the Primary Health Centre Manager at the Adelaide River Community Health Centre, who indicated that there are no concerns at this time. She also confirmed that NT Health, which includes the Centre, will provide a formal response during the community consultation period.</p> <p>Furthermore, any concerns or feedback from parties such as the school, place of worship, or other community members will be carefully considered and adhered to in order to ensure we fully support the community and prevent any disruption.</p> <p>Additionally, Ms Sharon Hillen communicated that the Coomalie Community Government Council has no concerns, provided that Mt Bundy Station operates in full compliance with its licence conditions, adheres to contemporary RSA principles, and does not offer liquor for takeaway from the premises. We fully intend to comply with these requirements to ensure there is no undue offence, annoyance, disturbance, or inconvenience to anyone in the area.</p>

If the applicant does not provide this information, it may affect their ability to obtain and maintain a licence/ registration.

We may share your information with the Liquor Commission, NT Police, Fire and Emergency Services, local council, the Department of Health and/or other authorities or people, but only if we are required or authorised by law to do so. We will also not use your personal information unless that use is required or authorised by law. You have a right to access the information we hold about you.
